HOUSEHOLD CRIME PREVENTION

Make your home more secure and buy piece of mind. Reduce the risk of burglary by taking some simple precautions:

- * Improve the security of doors and windows
- * Remove keys and keep them out of sight
- * Exterior doors should be in good condition and if possible fitted with a five-lever mortice deadlock and bolts at the top and bottom
- * Fit accessible windows with key operated window locks
- * High priced items should be kept out of sight - do not tempt the thief
- * Sheds and garages contain tools to help break into your home – don't leave them unlocked
- * Most burglaries happen when a house is empty - look in, when you're out
- * Never leave spare keys in a convenient hiding place - a thief will look there first
- * Light up your house and fit low energy bulbs, using timer switches to turn them on when you are out - thieves don't like being seen

EURO CYLINDER LOCKS

Over the years West Yorkshire Police has released advice about euro cylinder burglary and the vulnerability of certain locks. Our analysis, and information from other organisations, highlighted an issue with certain locks. West Yorkshire Police have been proactive in dealing with this issue, to ensure that euro-cylinder locks are tested robustly prior to coming to market. Techniques used by offenders evolve and testing methods need to evolve with them. As a result, a new testing process and standard has been introduced for euro-cylinder locks – **TS 007**. This is a significant step forward in addressing the vulnerability associated with this type of crime. The lock on your door is one aspect of domestic security, but there are other things you can look at to assist in preventing burglary. The security of your home starts at the perimeter of your property and ranges from security lighting to removing valuables and attractive items out of sight. Approximately 1 in 4 burglaries in West Yorkshire are committed via an unlocked door or window, so always remember to **lock them!**

GARDENWISE

Spring is around the corner and burglary of garden sheds and theft of garden equipment is on the rise.

Make it difficult:

- * Fit good locks to shed doors and windows and use them.
- * Postcode every item of property.
- * Lock doors and windows when in the garden - don't make it easy for sneak in thieves.
- * Detail identification marks on your property including scratches
- * Equipment should not be left unattended.
- * Walls, fences and gates should be kept in good condition.
- * Illuminate darker areas of the garden.
- * Keep hedges and shrubs cut back to avoid screens for thieves to work behind.
