www.police.uk aims to give you access to local crime and policing information in a way that is useful to you. This information could help you to take an active role in preventing crime and anti-social behaviour in your local community. The website is updated on or before the last working day of each month and will map incidents reported to the police in the preceding month.

LOCAL NEWS

Regular patrols and increased security from local residents has added to reduced crime rates at present.

Despite the good news, we all have to remain vigilant as surrounding areas have seen an increase in theft from sheds and garages, where it appears high value cycles are targeted. Thefts have involved forcing the lock and door, and even the removal of the door itself.

Please consider your security - shed alarms can be bought at low cost ... especially when the price of a stolen bike or other equipment is so high.

ANTI SNEAK-IN BURGLARY CAMPAIGN - SPRING/SUMMER

During the last 12 months burglary has reduced by 27% across the county; however it is still a major priority for the Force.

The clocks going forward often lead to an increase in sneak-in burglaries, in particular spring and summer, with the peak in June.

The Force is continuing with 'It Only Takes a Minute', encouraging people to think about home security and 'lock up or lose out!'

- It only takes a minute to lock doors and windows ... the same amount of time it takes for a burglar to enter your property.
- It only takes a minute to hide valuables out of view.
- Keep doors and windows locked, even when you are in. Try to change your habit if you don't lock your door behind you.
- Door chimes and burglar alarms will deter a burglar.
- Many insurance companies will not pay out if your home has been burgled while insecure.
- Keep doors and windows locked even when in the garden.
- Don't leave garden tools outside, as they can be used by burglars.
- Dispose of packaging; don't advertise what's in your house.
- Register on www.immobilise.com
- Download free tracking software onto mobile phones and laptops.

GARDENWISE

Burglary of garden sheds and theft of garden equipment is one of the fastest growing crimes.

Garden furniture and tools are very saleable items so you must make it difficult for any would be thief to get to your property.

- Good locks should be fitted to shed doors and windows – and use them!
- Postcode every item of property.
- Remember to lock doors and windows when out in the garden, do not make it easy for sneak in thieves.
- Detail any particular identification marks on your property including scratch marks.
- Equipment should never be left unattended.
- Walls, fences and gates should always be kept in good condition.
- Illuminate dark areas of your garden where possible.
- Screens for thieves to work behind should be avoided, keep hedges, shrubs and large plants cut back.
- Expensive or unusual items of equipment or garden ornaments should be photographed.

NOMINATED NEIGHBOUR

As part of the drive to combat burglaries, the Nominated Neighbour Scheme operates within the division. The aim of the scheme, using members of the community, is to help the vulnerable feel safer in their homes, in dealing with unwanted or unexpected people who visit.

The scheme enables these people to be protected by someone they know and trust, such as a neighbour, friend or relative.

The scheme is positive action that improves the safety of vulnerable people. It will limit the opportunity for doorstep callers to trick their way into homes or persuade residents to have unnecessary home improvements. Once they fail to gain access and know the local community is alert to their activities it will act as a strong deterrent to stop them from returning in the future.


